



Annual Management Report of Fund Performance

Management Discussion of Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund's investment objective is to achieve long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity and equity-related securities of companies located mainly outside of Canada and the United States.

The Fund follows a responsible approach to investing as described in Part A of the Simplified Prospectus.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in the Fund remain as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus. The Fund is suitable for investors investing for the long term, with a medium tolerance for risk. Any changes in the Fund have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

Results of Operations

The NEI International Equity RS Fund's Series A units returned 9.6% for the twelve months ended September 30, 2021 compared with a return of 19.2% for the benchmark explained below.

Unlike the benchmark return, the Fund's returns are after the deduction of fees and expenses paid by the Fund. Performance differences between series of units are mainly attributable to management fees charged to each series. Refer to the Past Performance section for the details of returns by series.

The benchmark for this Fund is the MSCI EAFE NR Index (C\$).

The Fund's net asset value increased by 148.10% during the period, from \$188,737,164 as at September 30, 2020 to \$468,248,456 as at September 30, 2021. This change in net assets is attributed to net unitholder activity of \$251,812,292 (which includes \$209,627,594 relating to fund merger activity) and \$27,699,000 to investment operations, including market appreciation (depreciation), income and expenses.

Factors That Have Affected Performance

Sector allocation was the primary detractor to the performance during the period. The overweight position in Health Care contributed to the Fund's overall underperformance as it was amongst the sectors that displayed the weakest return. The underweight position in the Financials sector also detracted from the Fund's performance as it was one of the best performing sectors in the benchmark. In contrast, the lack of exposure to the Utilities sector partially offset the negative impact from the sector allocation.

Stock selection also detracted the Fund performance. Contrary to the prior one-year period, when the Industrials and Information Technology sectors positively contributed to the Fund's performance, in this period Fund holdings from these sectors detracted the Fund's overall return. Finally, stock selection within Consumer Staples, and Financials positively contributed to the Fund's return.

Recent Developments

Regarding transactions, in the last quarter of 2020, a new position in Capgemini (France, IT Consulting and Other Services) was initiated. This company is well-positioned to benefit from the digital transformation that has accelerated during the pandemic. The portfolio sub-advisor also trimmed a few existing positions based on the risk-reward proposition and crystallized some gains from Hoya (Japan, Health Care Supplies), Linde (Germany, Industrial Gases), Nidec (Japan, Electrical Components and Equipment), LVMH (France, Apparel, Accessories and Luxury Goods), and Terumo (Japan, Health Care Equipment). In addition, the portfolio sub-advisor increased the positions in Fresenius SE (Germany, Health Care Services) and SAP (Germany, Application Software).

It should be noted that following the announcement in February 2020 that Worldline (France, Data Processing and Outsourced Services) would acquire Ingenico (France, Data Processing and Outsourced Services), the transaction was completed in the last quarter of 2020. As a result, Worldline has taken the place of Ingenico's position in the Fund.

2021 began with an addition to Fresenius SE (Germany, Healthcare Services), thus taking advantage of its low valuation. The second quarter of the current year continued in the same vein and the portfolio sub-advisor strengthened the position in Qiagen (Netherlands, Life Science Tools and Services) while trimming to crystalize gains from Diageo (UK, Distillers and Vintners), LVMH (France, Apparel, Accessories and Luxury Goods), and Richemont (Switzerland, Apparel, Accessories and Luxury Goods).

Consequently, during the last quarter of the period (Q3 2021) a new position was initiated in Tencent Holdings (China, Media, and Interactive Services). Tencent, through its subsidiaries, provides platforms dedicated to social networking, music, e-commerce, and online gaming as well as systems dedicated to payment, entertainment, artificial intelligence, and technology solutions. The size of the Chinese market and the accelerating trends of various services offered through digital, supports a strategic positioning for Tencent within its industry as well as having appealing long-term growth opportunities.

Finally, the portfolio sub-advisor crystallized some gains in Diageo (UK, Distillers and Vintners), Hoya (Japan, Health Care supplies), Novo Nordisk (Denmark, Pharmaceuticals), and Experian (UK, Research and Consulting Services) and further strengthened its positions in Reckitt Benckiser (UK, Household Products), Worldline (France, Data Processing and Outsourced Services), Prudential (UK, Life and Health Insurance), and Tencent Holdings (China, Media, and Interactive Services).

The investment approach of the sub-advisor is focused on the long term. The investment philosophy and process emphasize secular and sustainable growth themes that can be leveraged by global players with key competitive advantages and seasoned management teams. The portfolio sub-advisor believes that these attributes enable companies to generate strong and sustainable results over time. The portfolio sub-advisor continues to assess the impact of COVID-19 pandemic on companies as well as the affected industries and keep an eye on opportunities that allow to improve the Fund's risk-return profile.

Fund Merger

On March 9, 2021, at a special meeting of unitholders, unitholders approved the merger of NEI International Equity Fund into NEI International Equity RS Fund. This merger was executed at the close of business on April 16, 2021. This merger is not considered a material change from the Fund's perspective.

Management fee rates were reduced, effective April 9, 2021, from 2.00% to 1.95% for Series A, from 1.00% to 0.90% for Series F, from 1.75% to 1.70% for Series P, and from 0.75% to 0.70% for Series PF.

Administration fee rates were reduced, effective April 9, 2021, from 0.45% to 0.40% for Series A, from 0.35% to 0.30% for Series F and P, and from 0.30% to 0.25% for Series PF.

Independent Review Committee

The term of William Woods ended on September 30, 2021. Mr. Woods had served with distinction on the Independent Review Committee ("IRC") since October 2015. After consulting with the Manager and obtaining the Manager's consent, the IRC re-appointed Mr. Woods for a further period of three years.

Related Party Transactions

Northwest & Ethical Investments L.P. ("NEI LP") is the Manager, Trustee, Portfolio Manager and Registrar of the Fund. Northwest & Ethical Investments Inc., the general partner of NEI LP, is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Aviso Wealth Inc. ("Aviso"). Aviso is also the sole limited partner of NEI LP. Aviso is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Aviso Wealth LP, which in turn is owned 50% by Desjardins Financial Holding Inc. and 50% by a limited partnership owned by the five Provincial Credit Union Centrals and the CUMIS Group Limited. Desjardins Financial Holding Inc. is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Fédération des caisses Desjardins du Québec ("Fédération").

NEI LP charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. NEI LP in turn, pays all operating expenses of the Fund, other than specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expense of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, and brokerage commissions) which include payments to related parties. These services are in the normal course of operations and are measured at an exchange amount that is consistent with other independent parties. Desjardins Trust Inc. ("Desjardins Trust") is the custodian of the Fund. Desjardins Trust is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Fédération. The Fund may engage in securities lending and repurchase transactions, and Desjardins Trust may act as the Fund's securities lending and repurchase transactions agent ("Agent"). Any revenue earned on such transactions is split 60%—40% between the Fund and the Agent. Desjardins Securities Inc. ("DSI") is a broker responsible for security transactions on behalf of the Fund. DSI is wholly-owned subsidiary of the Fédération.

The Fund's sub-advisors may place a portion of their fund transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of NEI LP, provided that the affiliate's trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated qualified brokerage firms.

The Fund is distributed through Credential Asset Management Inc., Credential Qtrade Securities Inc., and members of the Desjardins group and other nonrelated parties by way of shared ownership. NEI LP pays to these parties distribution and servicing fees based on a percentage of the daily values of the units of each held by the dealer's clients and additionally, in some cases, on the amount of initial purchase.

NEI LP has established the IRC for the Fund in accordance with the requirements of National Instrument 81-107 – Independent Review Committee for Investment Funds in order to review conflicts of interest as they relate to investment fund management. The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Fund's IRC with respect to any related party transactions.

(2) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other Fund transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

(3) The portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's sub-advisor manages its investment holdings. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

(4) At the close of business on April 16, 2021, the NEI International Equity Fund was merged into the NEI International Equity RS Fund. The portfolio turnover rates exclude the value of securities acquired and sold to realign the Fund's holdings.

Management Fees

The Manager is responsible for the management, supervision and administration of the Fund. The Manager receives from the Fund management fees, before HST, calculated daily on the net asset value of the Fund at an annual rate shown below. The Fund does not pay management fees for Series I and O units. Series I and O unitholders pay a negotiated fee directly to NEI Investments.

The management fee covers the cost of investment advisory fees, sales, marketing, and distribution expenses of the Fund. In addition, the Manager may pay a trailer fee to dealers out of this management fee. The trailer fee is a percentage of the average daily value of the units of the Fund held by the dealer's clients. No trailer fees are paid in respect of any Series F and PF units of the Fund.

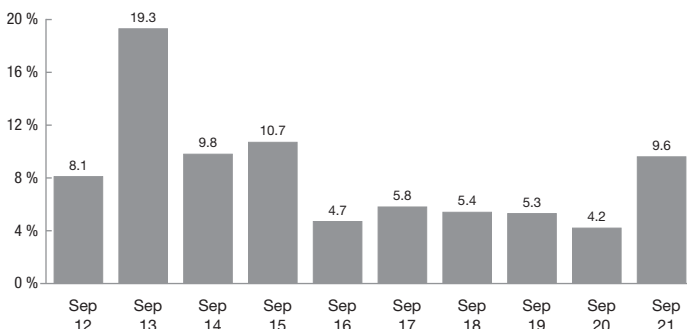
Past Performance

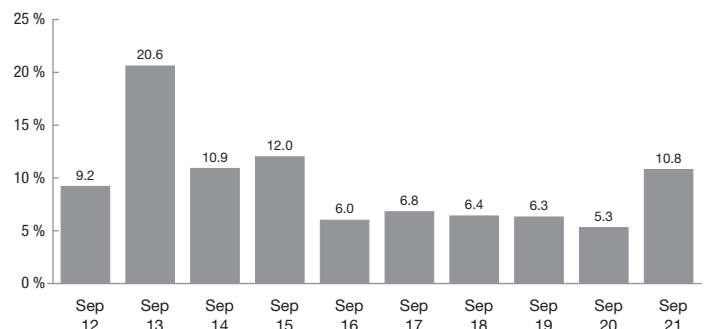
Year-by-Year Returns

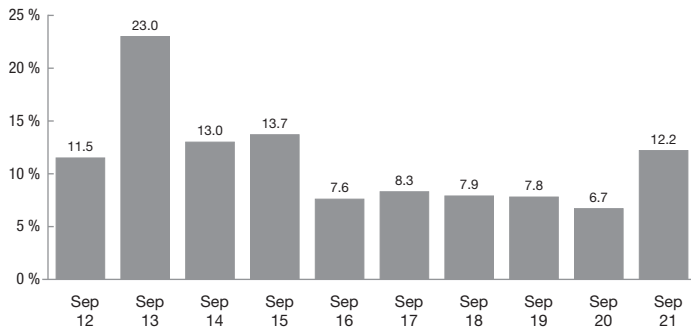
Series A



Series F



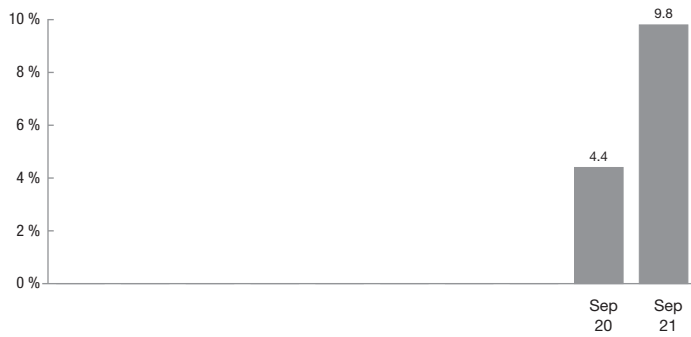
Series I



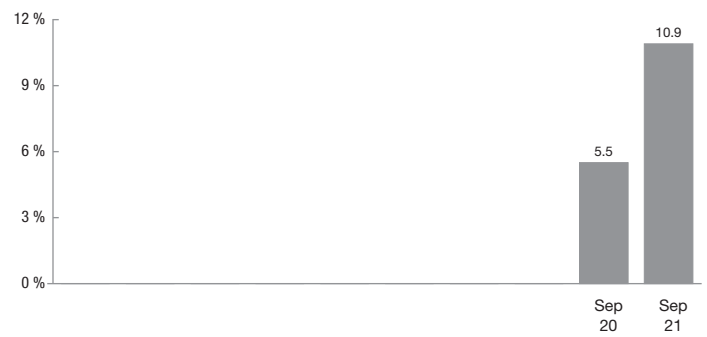
Series O

Annualized Compound Returns

The benchmark for this Fund is the MSCI EAFE NR Index (C\$).

The MSCI EAFE Index is composed of over 1,000 large company stocks from over 20 of the world's industrialized nations. It does not include stocks issued in North America.

While the Fund uses this benchmark for long-term performance comparisons, it is not managed relative to the composition of the Index. As a result, the Fund may experience periods when its performance is not aligned with the Index, either positively or negatively.
