Management Discussion of Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund's investment objective is to provide security of capital and to increase its value through capital appreciation and reinvestment of revenues by investing primarily in a mix of (i) equity securities of Canadian and foreign companies and (ii) bonds, debentures and other securities issued by governments, financial institutions and companies in Canada and in the United States and other foreign countries.

The Fund may gain exposure to Canadian fixed income securities and to United States and other foreign investments by investing in securities of mutual funds, including other Funds managed by NEI Investments.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in the Fund remain as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus. This Fund is suitable for investors investing for the medium to long term, with a low to medium tolerance for risk. Any changes in the Fund have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

Results of Operations

The NEI Growth & Income Fund's Series A units returned 19.8% for the twelve months ended September 30, 2021 compared with a return of 18.4% for the benchmark explained below.

Unlike the benchmark return, the Fund's returns are after the deduction of fees and expenses paid by the Fund. Performance differences between series of units are mainly attributable to management fees charged to each series. Refer to the Past Performance section for the details of returns by series.

The blended benchmark is composed of 25% FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index, 55% S&P/TSX Composite TR Index and 20% MSCI World NR Index (C\$).

The Fund's net asset value increased by 6.23% during the period, from \$352,925,215 as at September 30, 2020 to \$374,901,865 as at September 30, 2021. This change in net assets is attributed to net unitholder activity of -\$51,918,256 and \$73,894,906 to investment operations, including market appreciation (depreciation), income and expenses.

Factors That Have Affected Performance

A larger than expected fiscal stimulus, thanks to the Biden election win, combined with the economic re-opening following the successful vaccine rollout increased investor sentiment during the twelve-month period ending September 30, 2021. Improved investor expectations drove both Canadian and US equity markets higher.

Over the last few months, the North American economy enjoyed rapid growth as COVID-19 driven shutdowns and restrictions were lifted. Interest rates continue to be extremely accommodating which further supports broad economic growth.

In Canadian equities, the largest positive contributor to performance during the reporting period was the Fund's investment in copper miner First Quantum Minerals. Investor sentiment improved considerably due to higher commodity prices while the company continued to execute very well. Other significant contributors were real estate service provider Colliers International, Magna International, TD Bank and GFL Environmental. The largest detractors of performance during the reporting period were Fund holdings that did not keep pace with the market, not necessarily absolute decliners. This includes holdings such as Las Vegas Sands, Quebecor, Superior Plus, Fiserv and AT&T.

In Global equities, relative sector performance was strong in consumer discretionary and financials. Re-opening opportunities drove the outperformance led by UK homebuilder Taylor Wimpey, retailer Capri as well as hotel operator Extended Stay America. Within Financials, positions of Blackstone and Ameriprise Financial benefitted from AUM growth as well as upside to fee-related income. Health care was the largest detractor over the past year led by Amedisys. The company is a leading post-acute care provider with home health, hospice, and personal care offerings. In the period, Amedisys lowered 2021 guidance amid Hospice pressure.

In Canadian bond, the Fund's consistent overweight in Corporate bonds during this period was a key source of value added with the exposure concentrated in the mid to shorter term issues. Notwithstanding the success of this approach, the Fund's focus on higher quality issues was a slight drag on results. In the Provincial Bond market, the Fund's underweight also added value while concentration of holdings in the mid to long bond area were a source of value add versus the return from similar maturities for Federal bonds.

Recent Developments

In Canadian equities, new positions included Brookfield Asset Management and Superior Plus. Alternative asset manager, Brookfield, was acquired at a discount to comparable US operators while the sub-advisor expects tailwinds will continue to drive new fund growth. Additionally, internal developments within Brookfield's private equity segment, opportunities to realize value from its real estate division and management's expansion into technology and insurance verticals should drive free cash flow. Following the divestiture of its chemicals segment, Superior Plus is now a focused distributor of propane in both Canada and the US. The company has a strong foundation, thanks to long customer relationships, from which management will continue to execute its proven acquisition program. New US-listed holdings include cable and broadband provider Comcast, cell phone tower landlord Crown Castle, financial service technology provider Fiserv and wireless carrier T-Mobile. The portfolio sub-advisor believes that cable operators like Comcast are structurally advantaged due to their local monopolies. This advantage should continue to translate into low customer churn and wireless subscriber growth. Additionally, Comcast's theme parks are extremely valuable assets that will experience heightened demand over the coming years. Lastly, media assets, such as Comcast's NBCUniversal, offer compelling near term cash flow and long-term optionality should they successfully transition to an over-the-top, Netflix like subscription service. Crown Castle, Fiserv and T-Mobile enjoy enduring competitive advantages where management teams should accelerate shareholder value over the coming years from internal developments. During the period, the portfolio sub-advisor exited investments in Abbott Labs, Onex Corporation and AT&T as the underlying thesis changed and the discount to fair value no longer offered adequate returns. Brookfield Property Partners was eliminated after a successful takeover from parent company Brookfield Asset Management. Additional divestitures included Newell Brands and Lazard as the share prices reached the sub-advisor's appraisal value.

In Global equities, the sub-advisor believes that semiconductor chip shortages are having a widespread impact and various company management's commentary and guidance imply near-term unknowns. This backdrop coupled with elevated commodity prices, led by oil, are likely to keep inflation on the back of market's minds and potentially lead to more Central Banks to reassess their monetary policies. Growth and innovative companies should continue to benefit from long-term secular tailwinds, including e-commerce, digital payments, cloud computing, energy transition, EV, automation, and digitalization. Not all cyclicals are created equal, and some cyclicals have witnessed significant valuation improvement and lack sustainable earnings growth. These are the companies the Fund will continue to avoid.

In fixed income, the Fund has reduced its overweight exposure to corporates, as it is positioned defensively in the sector. The overweight exposure in the corporate sector is focused on higher-quality and, mid to shorter-duration bonds. The positive carry on long-term Provincial bonds, on a risk-adjusted basis, remain attractive relative to comparable term Federals and Corporates. The portfolio sub-advisor is maintaining Provincial weighting, and duration of Provincials, as the yield carry remains attractive in comparison to Federals. They will continue to alter positions as opportunities present themselves.

Independent Review Committee

The term of William Woods ended on September 30, 2021. Mr. Woods had served with distinction on the Independent Review Committee ("IRC") since October 2015. After consulting with the Manager and obtaining the Manager's consent, the IRC re-appointed Mr. Woods for a further period of three years.

Related Party Transactions

Northwest & Ethical Investments L.P. ("NEI LP") is the Manager, Trustee, Portfolio Manager and Registrar of the Fund. Northwest & Ethical Investments Inc., the general partner of NEI LP, is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Aviso Wealth Inc. ("Aviso"). Aviso is also the sole limited partner of NEI LP. Aviso is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Aviso Wealth LP, which in turn is owned 50% by Desjardins Financial Holding Inc. and 50% by a limited partnership owned by the five Provincial Credit Union Centrals and the CUMIS Group Limited. Desjardins Financial Holding Inc. is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Fédération des caisses Desjardins du Québec ("Fédération").

NEI LP charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. NEI LP in turn, pays all operating expenses of the Fund, other than specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expense of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, and brokerage commissions) which include payments to related parties. These services are in the normal course of operations and are measured at an exchange amount that is consistent with other independent parties. Desjardins Trust Inc. ("Desjardins Trust") is the custodian of the Fund. Desjardins Trust is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Fédération. The Fund may engage in securities lending and repurchase transactions, and Desjardins Trust may act as the Fund's securities lending and repurchase transactions agent ("Agent"). Any revenue earned on such transactions is split 60%—40% between the Fund and the Agent. Desjardins Securities Inc. ("DSI") is a broker responsible for security transactions on behalf of the Fund. DSI is wholly-owned subsidiary of the Fédération.

Where applicable the amounts paid in commission by the Fund to DSI and amounts received from underlying funds managed by NEI LP during the period are presented.

The Fund's sub-advisors may place a portion of their fund transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of NEI LP, provided that the affiliate's trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated qualified brokerage firms.

The Fund is distributed through Credential Asset Management Inc., Credential Qtrade Securities Inc., and members of the Desjardins group and other nonrelated parties by way of shared ownership. NEI LP pays to these parties distribution and servicing fees based on a percentage of the daily values of the units of each held by the dealer's clients and additionally, in some cases, on the amount of initial purchase.

NEI LP has established the IRC for the Fund in accordance with the requirements of National Instrument 81-107 – Independent Review Committee for Investment Funds in order to review conflicts of interest as they relate to investment fund management. The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Fund's IRC with respect to any related party transactions.

(1) Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, as well as withholding taxes) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

(2) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other Fund transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

(3) The portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's sub-advisor manages its investment holdings. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

(4) Effective January 18, 2019 Series T has been discontinued and all assets have been merged into Series A.

Management Fees

The Manager is responsible for the management, supervision and administration of the Fund. The Manager receives from the Fund management fees, before HST, calculated daily on the net asset value of the Fund at an annual rate shown below. The Fund does not pay management fees for Series I and O units. Series I and O unitholders pay a negotiated fee directly to NEI Investments.

The management fee covers the cost of investment advisory fees, sales, marketing, and distribution expenses of the Fund. In addition, the Manager may pay a trailer fee to dealers out of this management fee. The trailer fee is a percentage of the average daily value of the units of the Fund held by the dealer's clients. No trailer fees are paid in respect of any Series F and PF units of the Fund.

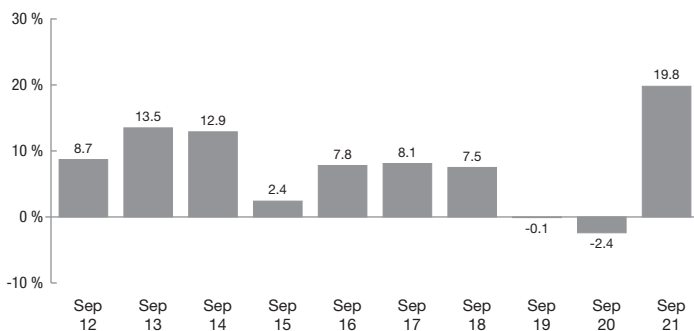

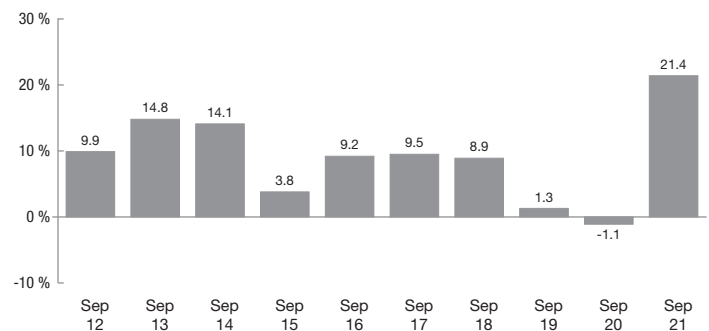
Year-by-Year Returns

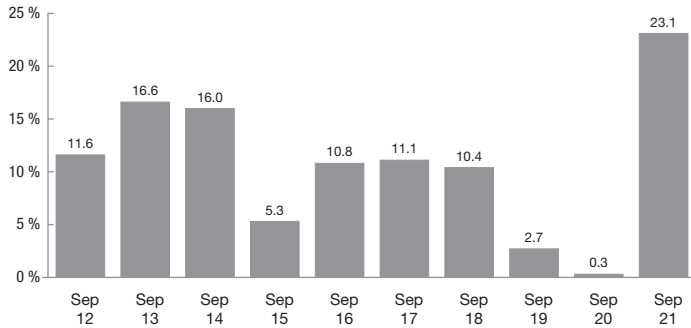

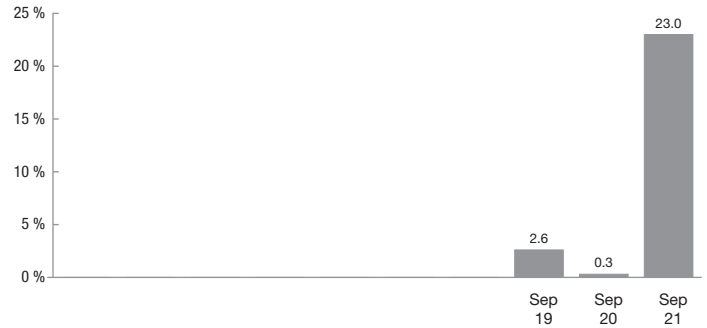

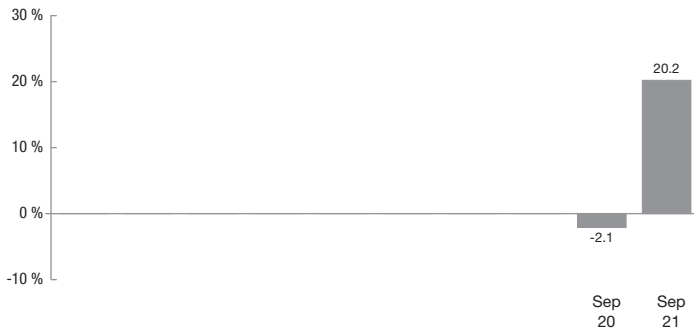

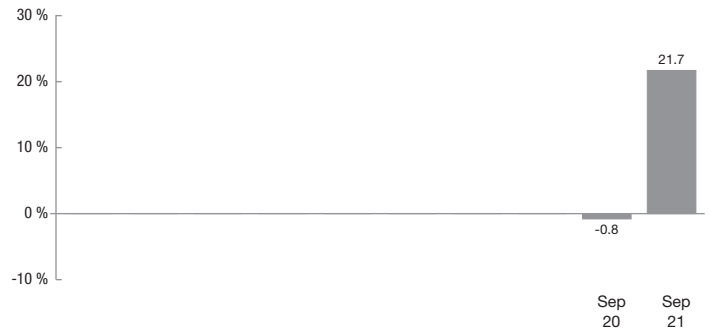

Annualized Compound Returns

The following table shows the annual compound returns for all series of the Fund. All returns are in Canadian dollars, on a total return basis, net of fees. For comparison, the returns for the benchmark are included. A discussion regarding the relative performance of the Fund is found in the Results of Operations section of this report and a description of indexes can be found in the Annualized Compound Returns section of this report.

The blended benchmark is composed of 25% FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index, 55% S&P/TSX Composite TR Index and 20% MSCI World NR Index (C\$).

The FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index is designed to be a broad measure of the Canadian investment grade fixed income market. Returns are calculated daily, and are weighted by market capitalization, so that the return on a bond influences the return on the index in proportion to the bond's market value. There are four main credit or borrower categories: bonds issued by the Government of Canada (including Crown Corporations), provincial bonds (including provincially guaranteed securities), municipal bonds, and corporate bonds.

The S&P/TSX Composite is the headline index for the Canadian equity market. It consists of the largest companies on the Toronto Stock Exchange (TSX). The Index is comprised of the S&P/TSX 60 Index and the S&P/TSX Completion Index.

The MSCI World Index is designed to represent the performance of large- and mid-cap stocks across numerous developed markets. It is a free float-adjusted market capitalization weighted Index.

While the Fund uses this benchmark for long-term performance comparisons, it is not managed relative to the composition of the Index. As a result, the Fund may experience periods when its performance is not aligned with the Index, either positively or negatively. Please see the "Results of Operations" section of this report for a discussion of recent performance results.
